From the Principal's Desk

Congratulations to the P&C for running a successful election day barbecue and cake stall, selling out on the day. Thank you for giving up your time on Saturday March 23, to raise funds for our school.

Another big thank you also from the LPS school community to the P&C for their donation and installation of new fans in the hall. These very large fans are a welcome addition to whole school assemblies and functions, particularly during warmer months. The fans are notably much more powerful but operate on less electricity than the several



that we had installed already. The fans and the install have totalled over \$19 000, of community raised funds.




I meet fortnightly with the Home School Liaison Officer (HSLO) who monitors attendance. We discuss students with attendance of less than 85% and those that have not provided an explanation for their absence. Interventions are also put into place to support improved attendance. If you are experiencing difficulties with getting your child to school please contact their classroom teacher to discuss your concerns.

Re: Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability (NCCD)

Every year, all schools in Australia participate in the Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability (NCCD). The NCCD process requires schools to identify information already available in the school about supports provided to students with disability. These relate to legislative requirements under the *Disability Discrimination Act 1992* and the Disability Standards for Education 2005, in line with the *NCCD guidelines* (2019).

Information provided about students to the Australian Government for the NCCD includes:

- year of schooling
- category of disability: physical, cognitive, sensory or social/emotional
- level of adjustment provided: support provided within quality differentiated teaching practice, supplementary, substantial or extensive.

This information assists schools to:

- formally recognise the supports and adjustments provided to students with disability in schools
- consider how they can strengthen the support of students with disability in schools
- develop shared practices so that they can review their learning programs in order to improve educational outcomes for students with disability.

The NCCD provides state and federal governments with the information they need to plan more broadly for the support of students with disability.

The NCCD will have no direct impact on your child and your child will not be involved in any testing process. The school will provide data to the Australian Government in such a way that no individual student will be able to be identified – the privacy and confidentiality of all students is ensured. All information is protected by privacy laws that regulate the collection, storage and disclosure of personal information. 
